A Pack is made up of smaller groups called Dens. Each Den consists of children of the same age, allowing learning and activities to be tailored to their developmental stage.



LION DEN (Kindergarten)

- Focus: Exploration & Participation**
- Introduction to group learning
 - Basic teamwork
 - Trying new activities



TIGER DEN (1st Grade)

- Focus: Curiosity & Engagement**
- Asking questions
 - Family involvement in learning
 - Early responsibility



WOLF DEN (2nd Grade)

- Focus: Skill Building**
- Following instructions
 - Problem-solving basics
 - Developing independence



BEAR DEN (3rd Grade)

- Focus: Confidence & Application**
- Applying learned skills
 - Working in teams
 - Taking initiative



WEBELOS DEN (4th Grade)

- Focus: Preparation & Leadership**
- Leadership development
 - Outdoor and practical skills
 - Increased responsibility



ARROW OF LIGHT DEN (5th Grade)

- Focus: Mastery & Transition**
- Demonstrating independence
 - Leading others
 - Preparing for the next level



Scouts BSA (6th Grade +)

- Focus: Youth-led teams and decision-making**
- Advanced outdoor and survival skills
 - Goal setting through merit badges
 - Long-term skill development and accountability
